College Broadcast Winner: "Breaking Down Barriers" by Rachel Anderson, Megan Carrick, Justin Peterson and Chris Welch of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln takes on the perception of immigration through a comparative analysis of Turkish immigrants in Germany and Hispanic immigrants in the United States. The students found that people from different cultures, with different beliefs, benefited mutually by working and communicating with each other. In doing so, the students also discovered that people can find better ways to break down barriers of ethnic perception that often divide them.

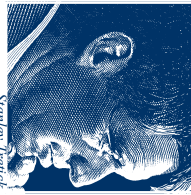

Entry Requirements: Entries are accepted in print and broadcast from both undergraduate and graduate level students.

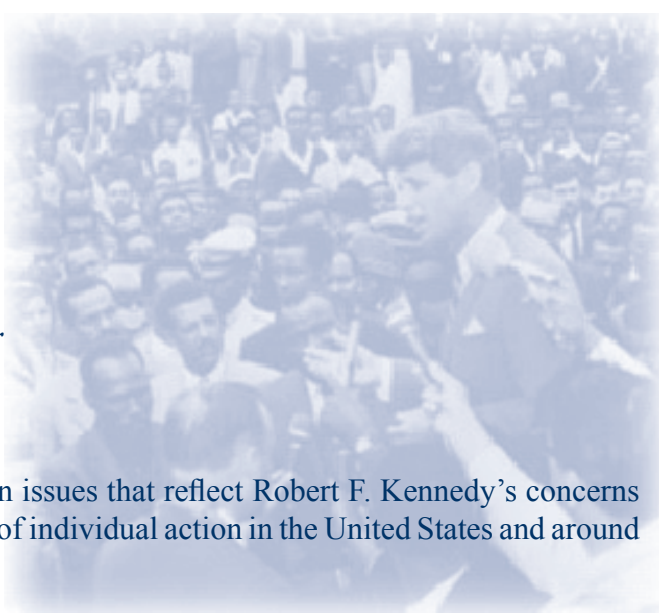
- Entries may include news or news-feature stories published or broadcast in the 2008 calendar year.
- Entries must be received by **Friday, January 30, 2009.**

Late entries will not be accepted.

- A copy of the official entry form (on right) must accompany each entry; the form may be photocopied.
- Print entries must include original tear sheets and two copies of the edited story.
- Minimum entry length: 500 words.
- Television entries must be in CD format and must include a copy of the program transcript.
- Radio entries must include a transcript.

Each Winner will receive a \$500 cash prize and will be flown to Washington, DC to attend an awards ceremony honoring student and professional work in the spring of 2009. Airfare and accommodations will be provided by the Robert F. Kennedy Center for Justice & Human Rights. While in Washington, DC, students will be offered the opportunity to meet with professional journalists in their field of interest.
